


Most Popular Panto of all Time

Our Pantomime Secretary Geraint Webb takes time out to find which pantomime is the UK's most popular for 2014/2015.

Pantomime is a truly British phenomenon though it is difficult to directly trace its origins. What's certain is that between the months of November to February, audiences all over the country flock to watch and support their local panto. But who's the fairest of them all? Cinderella, of course! Cinderella has always tended to attract more crowds than any other pantomime – it's certainly has been for many years, the most regularly performed pantomime of them all. APC have in fact have performed Cinderella 9 times in its 83 year long history, which has therefore been a firm favourite in Abergavenny. However is Cinderella still the most popular pantomime today?

Well NODA (National Operatic and Dramatic Association) has recently trawled its very comprehensive panto listings to find out which shows are the most commonly performed. Interestingly statistics from the National Database of Pantomime Performance and the first ever National Amateur Panto Survey revealed that Aladdin is both the professional and amateur sector's most popular pantomime for 2014/2015. The Disney's version of Cinderella although released back in 1950, remains a classic and has pride of place in most families Disney DVD collections, and Aladdin has benefitted ever since the Disney film came out in 1992.





While it seems Aladdin is the title of choice for amateur dramatic societies up and down the country, Sleeping Beauty was in second place. Interestingly Cinderella and Dick Whittington in joint third, while lack and the Beanstalk fourth and Robin Hood and the Babes in the Wood fifth. In total, 175 amateur dramatic clubs, societies and organisations participated in the National Amateur Panto Survey, with the National Database of Pantomime Performance currently listing 191 professional productions for the 2014/2015 season. 'Qdos Entertainment' which holds the accolade of being the largest producer of pantomimes in the world staged 24 pantomimes around the UK during the 2014/2015 pantomime season. Interestingly only 5 of these pantomimes were Cinderella, which were performed at Glasgow, Cardiff, Llandudno, Southampton and Wolverhampton.

Over recent years APC have organised its own coach trip to see a professional Qdos pantomime. Last month a coach of over 50 panto members, family and friends had the opportunity to see Cinderella at the New Theatre, Cardiff. It stared (former 'Any Dream Will Do' contestant) Lee Mead, (former Welsh Rugby International) Gareth Thomas and (Welsh Comedian) Mike Doyle. This production was of the highest quality, fantastic costumes and sets, clever special effects, a strong cast of performers, thankfully lots of live music and singing and dancing, all of which made an excellent evening out. The show also had its own standing ovation at the end. One thing for sure was the panto trip inspired everyone at APC to pull out all the stops to perform its own version of 'Cinderella'.

A Night of Theatrical Stars

The fourth successful amateur A4B Amateur Theatre Awards Presentation gala took place at Abergavenny's Angel Hotel on Saturday 24th January 2015, which was organised by 'A4B'. It was attended by over ninety people. Abergavenny Pantomime Company would like to thank the following Company Members:

The best actor in a supporting role under eighteen was Brandon Jones for his performance in AAODS production of Cats. The best act under eighteen was Zac Williams for his performance as Rumpelstiltskin in last



year's panto. The best actor in a supporting role was Stephen (Snowy) Clark in Abergavenny Theatre Group for Black Comedy. The best actor was Joe Pugh for his performance in AAODS production of Cats. The Judges award went to the Clark family (Jaci, Molly and Snowy) for their dedicated involvement with amateur theatre in Abergavenny. The Bernard Zavishlock Award for outstanding contribution to amateur theatre went to Adoree Flower (ex pantomime Company Member). Finally we were proud to say that the new off stage award went to the 'Abergavenny Pantomime Company Committee' for their hard work and team effort.







career, during the summer of 1995 Tony and Delwyn both decided to leave the Company, following a number of changes in the Production Team. On Delwyn's retirement he moved to west Wales, while he continued to keep in contact with his many friends in Abergavenny. His warmth and humour will be missed by many.

The British Heart Foundation has existed for 53 years and in that time it has more than halved the number of deaths from heart disease disorders. and genetic Notwithstanding this Heart British Heart disease still remains the biggest single killer in the UK. BHF is principally a research based Charity and last year



CYMRU

spent over £90 million (75% of our income) on research. BHF scientists in Cardiff (Aug 2014) discovered the defective gene that causes Sudden Adult Death – the condition suffered by Fabrice Muamba the Chelsea player who collapsed during a match. We now hope to develop a treatment strategy.

One in 180 births is born with a heart defect. Dylan lives in Newport. At 8 days old he underwent open-heart surgery. Many of the techniques used were those established as good practice by BHF Professor Magdi Yacoub who also pioneered heart transplant surgery. Dylan is now 2 and a half years old. He underwent is second open heart surgery six months ago to replace heart valves that had be put in when he was born, as they had become too small for his growing heart. He is well, active and if you saw him you would never know.

We also invest in Community projects and in October launched a Nation of Lifesavers. Secondary schools can sign up to get free inflatable CPR manikins and a DVD so the whole class can learn at once. We estimate that if everyone knew how to do CPR we would save 5000 lives a year to bring us in line with other European Countries.
